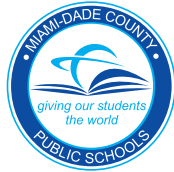
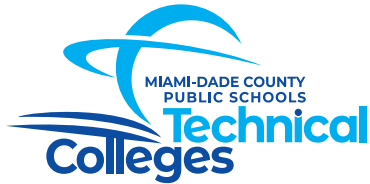

Program Outlook

The clinical competencies include: learning first aid and CPR; assisting the physician with medical and surgical procedures; taking vital signs, EKGs and basic X-rays; administering medications, and performing selected laboratory procedures including capillary stick and venipuncture.

Length of Program

The program is 1300 hours and includes 200 hours of clinical experience. Approximately 15 months are needed to complete the program. This program contains several occupational completion points designed to prepare students for various entry level jobs within this occupational area.

Entrance Requirements

- Application
- Interview by guidance counselor
- Assessment in reading, math, and language
- Fees for supplies and textbooks are required
- Uniform required
